Résumé

The spread or control of malaria disease may depend on acceptability of health services that control malaria disease. The study was carried out of Abia state in South Easter part of Nigeria. The data analyses were both qualitative and quantitative. It found that type of health services and level of education are related to the respondents, acceptance and use of health services. The high educated respondents had very strong feelings of social and psychological attachments to the type of health services they use. They had problem with adjustment and were not active in activities that encouraged malaria control. Thus, women used more health service than men.
